BLOCK Options to Promote Learning 24-36 Months

The Wind Blew by Pat Hutchins Large butcher paper, approximately 4 feet long Chunky crayons in assorted colors Also Promotes Cognitive Fine motor Invite several toddlers to read a silly book about a windy day Explain that the wind blows different objects up into the air Read the book, emphasizing the items the wind blows into the air
